Welcome Our Mission & Purpose

Per Article 2 of Constitution | Article 1 By-Laws of the Association

The Association provides a structure for class management and for the exchange of information among Canadian 29er sailors to enhance the enjoyment of these sailboats.

Its mission is to **promote, foster, encourage and sponsor 29er class racing** in Canada

- The Association sponsors the 29er Canadian National Championships, and Youth Championships, as well as the 29er Grand Prix Series.
- The Association works with the affiliate Class Associations to support the master 29er calendar, that includes the North American Championship, as well as regional events, and opportunities for education and clinics for class members across Canada.

The association is a volunteer run, unincorporated association, affiliated with the International 29er Class Association (29er.org) and Wind Athletes Canada.

The 29er's Place in Sailing

The 29er fleet is >3,000 strong. We're global. We're growing.

In 2025, there were > 26 Countries competing at World's; regularly seeing registrations of 250 boats

The 29er is an "open class" with no age limit and no gender constraints


In 2019, the World's were won by an all female team

For Opti & c420 Sailors, the 29er stepping stone offers the most options and flexibility in racing pathways


The 29er is a precursor for four Olympic level double-handed sailing fleets.

- First SK.O.T.S. happened today!

- 2nd place Midwinter's West RVicYC: Kai/ William
- North Americans in Maine 9 Canadian teams, 60%!, and a 2nd Place for Harper/ Maggie!
- Internationally: 1.5 Canadian Teams @ World's this year (congrats on a 47th Silver Fleet finish); and @ 2 teams @ Euros
- 11 teams @ Cork Youthfest, congrats to Sarah/Nicole
- Canada Games: 29ers fielded 17 teams from 10 provinces; improved from 14 and 7 provinces in 2022.

Canadian Nationals: Already bigger than ALL start lines in 2024 or 2025 @ 28 BOATS! We're in line with the US Class goal of "50 in 5" on the line



c. Reports from the Officers President: Ruby Patrickson

Membership Report: 18%↓

- As @ Aug 19, we have 52 members, 9 less than this time last year;
 - Erosion mostly in Atlantic region
 - Average age: 17.5 years old, ranging from 13 to 49 years old
 - Almost ½ now in U16 category
 - Signifying growth taking hold and good renewal with Yr 1 sailors
 - EVEN mix of Male & Female (50:50)



Update: The International Class Fielding 12 submissions; they're in support of 4

- The International 29er Class Association has roughly €500k
 - -> This has triggered some spending motions by Country Classes
- 1. Funding support of teams from outside a continent.
 - -> Funding of 50% of entry fee if event is inside Europe
- 2. Entry fees for Championships may not exceed €500
 - -> (World's, Europeans, Continental)
- 3. Protective cover around forestay stemhead fitting @ the bow
 - -> to protect rigging attachment points and prevent sail damage
- 4. Delete Class Rule C1.1 (a) and amend
 - -> to allow sculling in pre-start maneuvers & brings the 29er class rules in line with the 49er class rules

Consultation phase is underway; strategic plan within 90 days of World's

Update: The US ClassIdentified 5 Obstacles to Growth they are Tackling-

1. Boats, Sails and Transport

-> 20 new boats have been purchased for sale and charter

2. Coaches and Training

-> Funding for and sponsorship of foreign coach visas as well as domestic coach training clinics

3. Schedule/ Circuits

-> Yearly calendar to be set and communicated before year's end

4. Pipeline/ Development

-> Pipeline/ Development - running clinics and Intro Sessions

5. **Credibility**

-> Have new leadership and are restructuring

GOAL: "50 in 5" (50 boats on the start line at all major regattas within 5yrs) Achievable: Grow by 5 boats / year


c. Reports from the Officers Secretary/Treasurer: Jill Amery

- Currently projecting around \$3.2k in the bank after expenses (last year we had \$668)
 - Comfortable balance

d. Regional Report from the West Steve McBride | Sue Dyson

- Fleet currently at roughly 15 boats based out of BC
- Royal Van and Royal Vic are focused on 29er
 - · Coach Martin Kirketerp Ibsen hired on at Royal Van. 29er/49er
- BC teams hit Mids West in California March; 1 team @ Euros; Ladies won gold @ Canada Games
- Majority in the Victoria/Vancouver Area spanning 5 clubs with a few new clubs sending boat to events, which is great to see
- Mix of new and established teams. 2 teams in AB; MB & SK fielded teams for the Canada Games so looking to support further development there
- Grand Prix series underway
- This fall: working on "Try 29er Days" stay tuned

d. Regional Report from the East Jillian Ruch | Federico Donzino

- Fleet currently sitting with about 9 in Ontario and about 4 in QC
- This season brought many new partnerships which is exciting!
- 3 clubs in Toronto have 29er teams and coaches which leaves room for growth in Toronto, hoping for more teams and 420s to move into the class from the many clubs in the city
- Speaking with some clubs in Eastern Ontario to try to start some teams and coaching there
- Grand Prix series underway We have had 2 of the 3 events already. Really hoping to include a QC event next year

d. Regional Report from the Atlantic Mike Smith | Derek MacDonald | Chris Watters

- Region consists of the 4 Atlantic provinces (NS, NB, PE, NL)
 - Canada Games fielded boats from ALL 4 Atlantic Provinces!
 - Congratulations to Ethan and Henry, Gold @ the Canada Games
- Welcome Chris Watters as our new Regional Coach Rep
- 2 HP clinics: 10 29ers taking up the boat; Spring 29er Clinic with Guest Speaker Andrew Wood
- This year, lots of new teams and most activity (training/racing) is in Nova Scotia, spanning 4 clubs (approximately 12 boats) and multiple provinces on the move to Nova Scotia to make up good training and competition blocks...

e. Bids for CAN 29er Championship 2026 None submitted at this time

- The association's practice in recent history, in consultation with Sail Canada, has been to host the Canadian 29er Championships with the help of the Organizing Authority of CORK alongside other 49er Skiff Champs in Kingston.
- The Executive Tables the following motion: That, failing any other applications are received prior to September 1st 2025, that the Class Association work with the Organizing Authority @ CORK to set the dates for the 2026 Canadian Championships in Kingston, ON.
- Per our mandate, the Association will also consult on setting optimal dates for Canada's Youth Champs (with Sail Canada), North Americans (with US 29er Class Association), and set the Canadian Grand Prix Series (with Regional Rep input)

f. Nomination of Executive Article VI of the By-Laws

- Section 1. Make up and term of office for the Executive
 The Executive of the Association shall be the President, Secretary/Treasurer, and the four Regional Representatives.
 - All members of the Executive shall be elected for two (2) years.
 - No member of the executive shall hold the same position for more than four (4) consecutive years.
- Section 2. Regional Representatives

There may be one Representative on the Executive, elected from each of the four regions described as: Western (BC), Central (Alberta Saskatchewan and Manitoba), Eastern (Ontario and Quebec), Atlantic (New Brunswick, PEI, Nova Scotia and Newfoundland.

- Section 3. Coach Representatives and Builder Representative
 Each region may appoint a Coach Representative to attend at meetings.
 - The Coach Representative may hold a proxy for their Regional Representative and vote in the event that representative is unable to attend.
 - The Builder Representative attends all meetings but does not have a vote.
